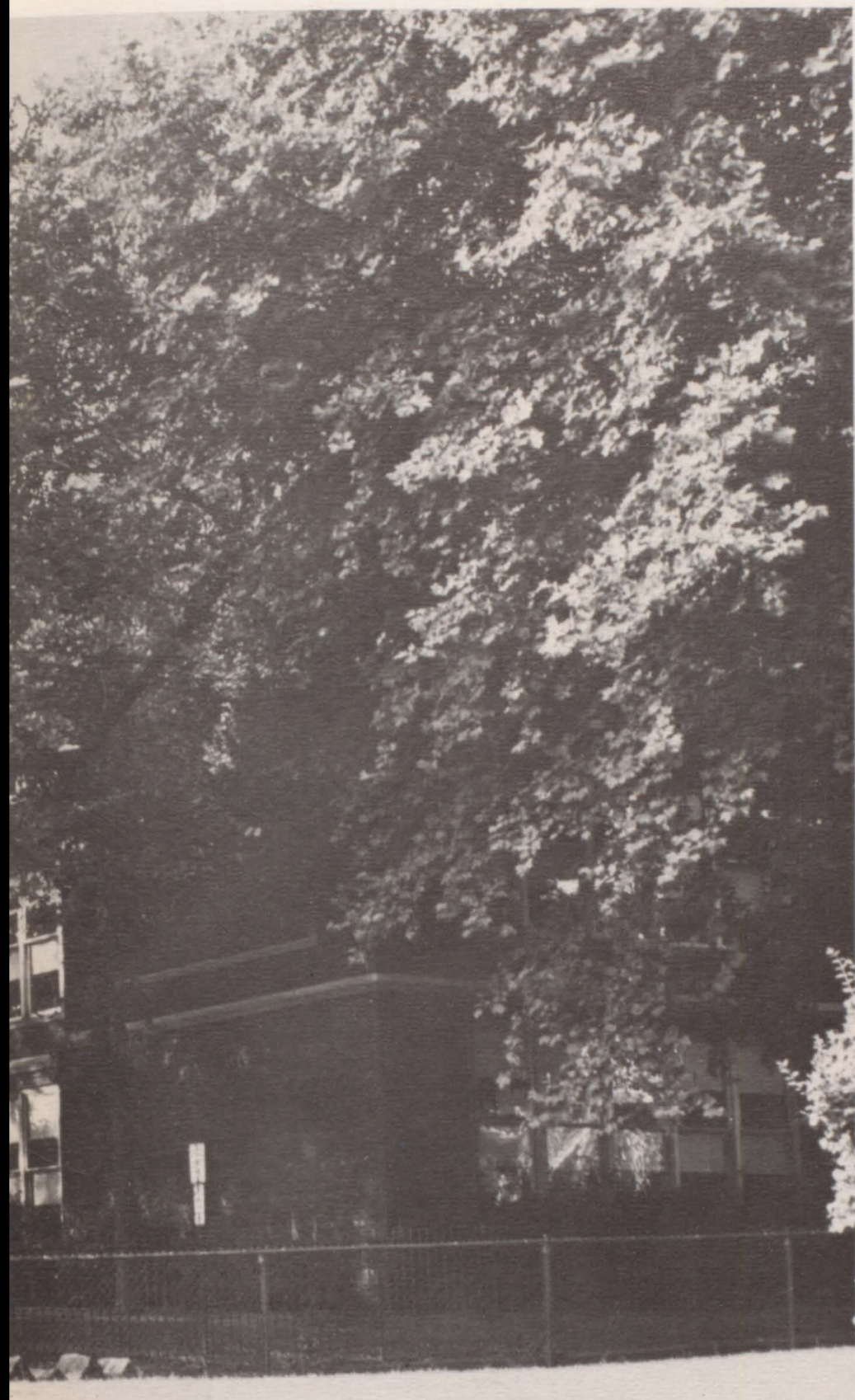
Mr. Baily will be missed, but as he leaves he takes with him many thanks for all he has done and countless good wishes for many happy years ahead.

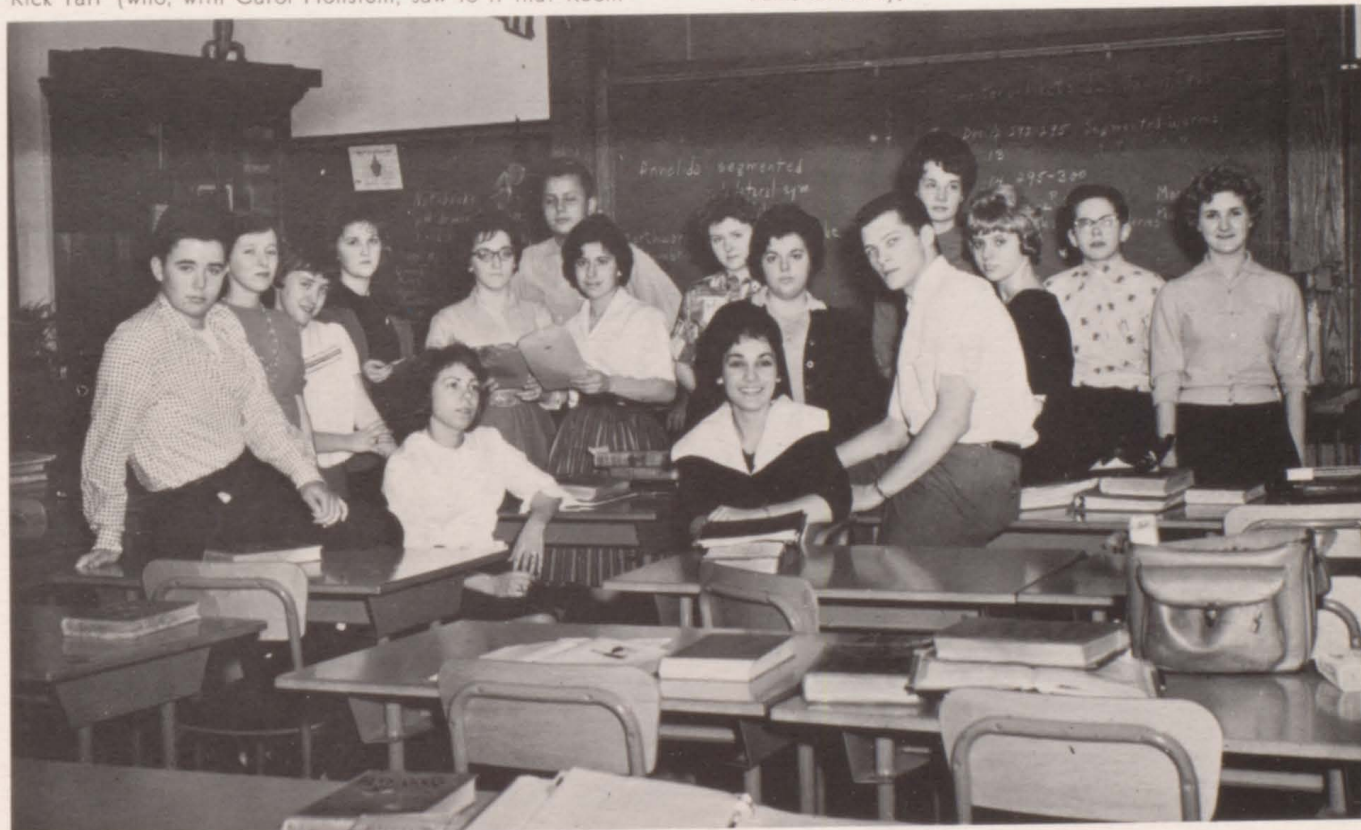

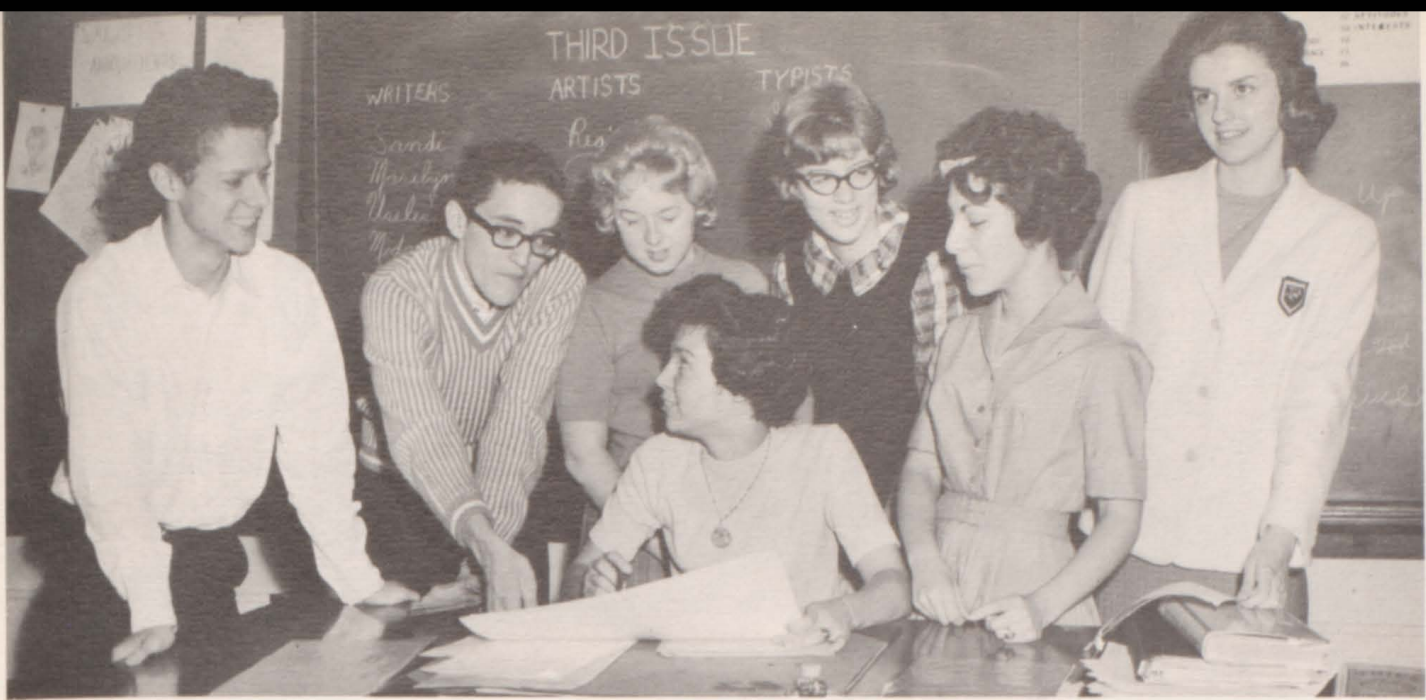
