HISTORY OF SWISSVALE

About the time the first gun was fired at Fort Sumter, announcing the beginning of the Civil War, the beauties of Swissvale, situated in Wilkins Township, were being brought to the attention of many people. Surrounded by fertile and well kept farms, the wooded hills, bountiful orchards, and waving fields of grain, provided a picturesqure and delightful setting for the dozen or so homes that made up Swissvale.

Jane Grey Swisshelm lived in a log house in what was known as the Nine Mile Run Hollow. She so loved this little village that she bestowed upon it the name of Swissvale, and that is how our borough received its present name. Mrs. Swisshelm's activities as a writer and one of the promoters of the Under-Ground Railroad for runaway slaves from the South, earned her fame and prestige which will remain and endure as a part of the history of all western Pennsylvania.

The first church building in Swissvale was a small frame structure which stood on James and Jane Swisshelm's land, about where Schoyer Avenue and Braddock Avenue presently connect. However, the church has disappeared and houses are now on this site.

The first shoemaker to live and do business in Swissvale, was a man by the name of John McFee. In addition to being a shoemaker, he was quite skillful in the art of making violins.

It may surprise you to learn that what is now Braddock Avenue, is a highway which still occupies this land today.

many years older than the Greensburg Pike. It was formerly known as old Braddock's Field Road and was completed and in use many years before Greensburg Pike.

The oldest school of which there seems to be any record, was a one room building which stood about where the present Methodist Church is located on Dickson Street. It is not known just when it was built, but pupils attended it as far back as 1820.

The Pennsylvania Railroad was first operated through Swissvale in 1852. The first railroad station was a small, two story wood frame building, which was torn down in 1908 and replaced by the present brick and terra-cotta building, located on Braddock Avenue, across from Winky's Drive-In Restaurant.

The first step from the transformation of Swissvale from a village to a town was in 1866. About this time, Dickson-Stewart Coal Company purchased all the coal underneath the Hill District of Swissvale. Their coal tipple was located at the bottom of what is now Columbia Avenue, and the coal cars ran up and down Columbia Avenue.

Another factor in Swissvale's growth was the Allegheny Car and Transportation Company. The industry was devoted to the manufacture of railroad freight cars. After continuing in business for about twelve years, they sold out to the Union Switch and Signal Company, which still occupies this land today.

Other events that took place outside of Swissvale, but which were also factors in the development of the town were the erection of the Edgar Thompson Steel Works in 1873 and the erection of the Homestead Steel Works in 1880.

From the time these plants were put into operation, the growth of our town, while slow, was nevertheless much more noticeable than previous to this time. There was no boom, just a slow, gradual increase in population.

The villages of Hawkins and Swissvale were incorporated as "The Borough of Swissvale" in March, 1898.

One of the greatest and most important events in the early history of our borough was the introduction of the street car service. With the much needed mobility now available, our town's population grew rapidly.

Tremendous strides in the way of improving our streets, our sewer systems, and other essential services have been made in the borough since its incorporation. Our municipal building, built in 1907, will compare to any other municipal building in this County.

When the United States entered the First World War, Swissvale sent over 800 of its finest young men to war, many of whom never returned. But, following World War I, Swissvale shared in national prosperity. During this period, a great many of our streets and alleys were paved, and a great many new homes were built.

The era of post war prosperity was followed by the most serious economic depression in our history. Swissvale, although hard hit, maintained its governmental equilibrium and did not go into debt, as did a great many municipalities.

It has been said that a municipality reflects the character of its citizens, and the people of our town can well take pride in its development from a mere hamlet to one of the finest residential communities in all of Allegheny County.

Their continued cooperation and public interest will make it an even finer place to live.




HISTORY OF SWISSVALE HIGH SCHOOL



Swissvale High School was founded in 1903, with a student body of 11 girls and one boy, with one teacher, Miss Wadell, and a principal, Marion C. Turrell. There were five subjects offered this first year — Latin, Algebra, Roman History, English and Arithmetic.

After a series of building changes, the contract for our present high school building was let by the School Board, April 14, 1920, for \$460,312. The building was opened for use in the fall of 1921 and this first class graduated from it in 1922.



The sounds of clicking keys, rustling paper, rubbing erasers, and tearing masking tape was very common in our commercial class, as the students worked to achieve proficiency in business skills.


First year typing students concentrated on fundamentals while second year students worked to develop greater speed and accuracy.


Bookkeeping students received basic training in accurate record keeping. In shorthand classes, girls practiced writing and recognizing many brief form symbols. Dictaphone machines gave office machine girls a chance for further advancement.

At least one half of our school's percentage of used masking tape can be accounted for by our Distributive Education students. It is here that students train for a career in retail marketing and sales. Besides learning the techniques of proper display building, using mannequins and actual display cases, these D.E. students learn the basic principles of marketing and sales, and then apply these principles in their on the job training throughout their senior year.


It's a way to avoid teachers that you don't like.

Junior — A mini-course is a six week History or English class, chosen by the individual student, on the basis of subject matter and relevance.

Senior — Our English and History Departments offer a mini-course program which is composed of a wide variety of interesting short compact units of study lasting six weeks in length. The concern in this program is placed on individual achievement, learning through discovery, and encouraging a sense of self-directed responsibility on the part of the student with the teacher serving as a guide and an evaluator.

Students Seek Insights








THE Bookies

Some of the courses offered are Accounting, Auto Body Repair, Commercial Art, Cosmetology, Dental Assistant, Marketing, Offset Printing, and Welding.



'MATH & SCIENCE DEPARTMENTS

Laboratory work is emphasized in almost all phases of the science student's development, for it is here that each student can discover many of life's secrets.





PHYSICAL EDUCATION

They deserve a lot of credit for a job well done.




The Student Council has come a long way in the past few years. Their main goal is to help students that may encounter problems during their stay at S.H.S.

Throughout the year, the council is truly in the spirit of helping their fellow human beings.




HISTORY OF BRADDOCK HILLS


EARLY HISTORY

Although Braddock Hills was incorporated in 1946, its history dates back to the colonial times of our country. Once a part of the region known as Braddock's field, it lies on the hilltops to the north and west of North Braddock. Quickly the region along the river grew as factories and small businesses evolved. This growth is partially attributed to the people of Hammatown, as Braddock was their market place, and many worked and attended church there. Two of the main highways of Braddock Hills were constructed early in our country's history. Brinton road, winding through the hilltops, was an Indian trail built near the ridges in order to watch for their enemies. Braddock Road, also a major highway, grew from an old country road used by farmers and miners to and from Braddock.

Braddock Hills was once a large agricultural area, with its many beautiful farms and woodlands. The area which is now Monongahela Cemetery was once a dense woodland. This land was cleared by a lumber company and made ready for farming by Adam Burkhardt. In plowing this area, cannon balls, arrowheads, and other evidences of a struggle were found - often thought of as remains of the Battle of Braddock. Some of the other farmers of that area included Hanna, McKelvey, Soles Alexander, Moore, O'Neil, Locke Cooke, Schaffer, and Hawkins.

Evidence of Braddock Hills' growth is seen throughout the area in the attractive new homes and businesses. The recently developed area of new homes has more than doubled its real estate value. The drive-in and office building are certainly signs of a growing community. The land next to the building, adjacent to the Penn Lincoln Parkway, shows promise for more construction. Also, the building of the Westinghouse Tele-Computer Center has added advancement to the Community. Playgrounds and Little League baseball facilities can be added to the list of advancements. Their efficient and growing police and firefighting forces are helping to protect the community which has grown to 2,370 citizens.

HANNATOWN

Plots of ground along Tasseys Hollow Road (then called Brinton Road) were organized into a little town known as Hannatown. On ground donated by Mr. Soles, a church was built in the early 1840's on the corner of Yost Boulevard and Brinton Road. In 1952 it was officially organized as a United Brethren Church which moved to North Braddock about 1875. On ground donated by Mr. Han-

na, the first school was built. It was located on the present site of Hannatown School. The favorite picnic areas of those times were found on Brinton Road near the cemetery, the Fall Hollow where Westinghouse is located.

MODERN BRADDOCK HILLS

Today Braddock Hills has grown into a modern community in relation to its size. Its people enjoy the facilities of the city, with the advantages of a country setting and beautiful view.
