Arnold Henry Koepka -- We salute you!

Mr. Koepka graduated from Trafford High School in 1932. He played varsity football for four years at Waynesburg College, where he was inducted into the Waynesburg College Sports Hall of Fame. He appeared in Who's Who in American Universities and Colleges in 1937-1938. In 1938, he graduated from Waynesburg with a Bachelor of Science degree.

The Philadelphia Eagles drafted Mr. Koepka following his senior year at Waynesburg and he reported for spring training. He decided to forego his professional football career because of reocurring knee injuries.

In 1946, he came to Swissvale, where he coached the Flashes football team for twelve years before confining his sports activities to Athletic Director. He received his Master's degree in education from the University of Pittsburgh in 1954. In 1961, the Trafford Alumni Association presented an award to Mr. Koepka for Outstanding Achievement for being appointed to the Waynesburg College "All-Time Great" football team.

We, the Swissvalian staff of 1977, take this time to recognize Mr. Arnold Henry Koepka as our "All-Time Great." We are deeply indebted to him for his 30 years of service to Swissvale Area High School. As he retires, we join the entire student body in saying, "Mr. Koepka, we salute you!"






Now that the year is over, let's rewind the film and take a look at the cast on the set. For, it is on the set that the cast spends most of its time.

Calculus, trigonometry, algebra, geometry and basic math are a few of the math courses offered in S.H.S. Calculus is an advanced course recommended for those Seniors who will attend college. It is mainly concerned with calculating rates of speed. Trigonometry, also an advanced course, deals with the unit circle, triangles, sines and co-sines, and graphs. In albegra, solving equations is stressed. Geometry students are taught how to prove problems with theorems and postulates. Basic math is a couse designed to help students strengthen their skills in addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.

Work Study which is headed by Mr. Kost and supervised by Mrs. Mallet, is a program offered to those seniors who are vocational business students. This program allows students to practice their secretarial skills. The students in Work Study are assigned to one of six areas: the office, library, English, history, science or math department. 


Singing their way into the hearts of men




To get ahead in life you have to take the first step, and many Swissvale students have taken this step at Forbes Road East Vocational Technical School.

After students finish in "Trail" for good, they will be well on their way down the road to success.




















SIRLS SOFTBALL TAKES SECTION










Couples danced to the music of "Twice as Nice" until midnight.




