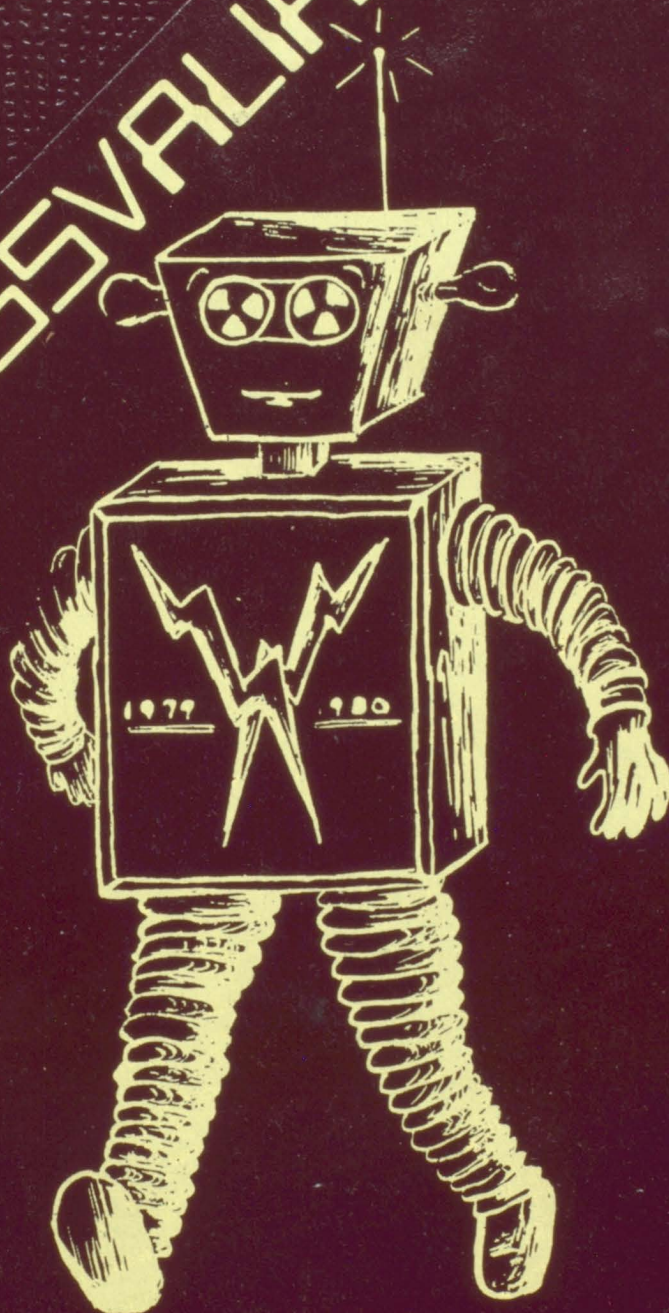

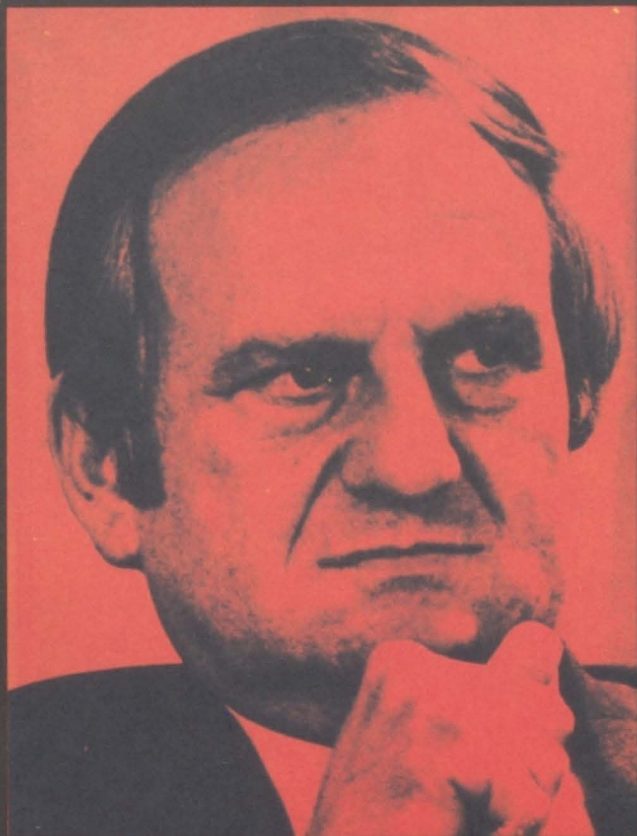

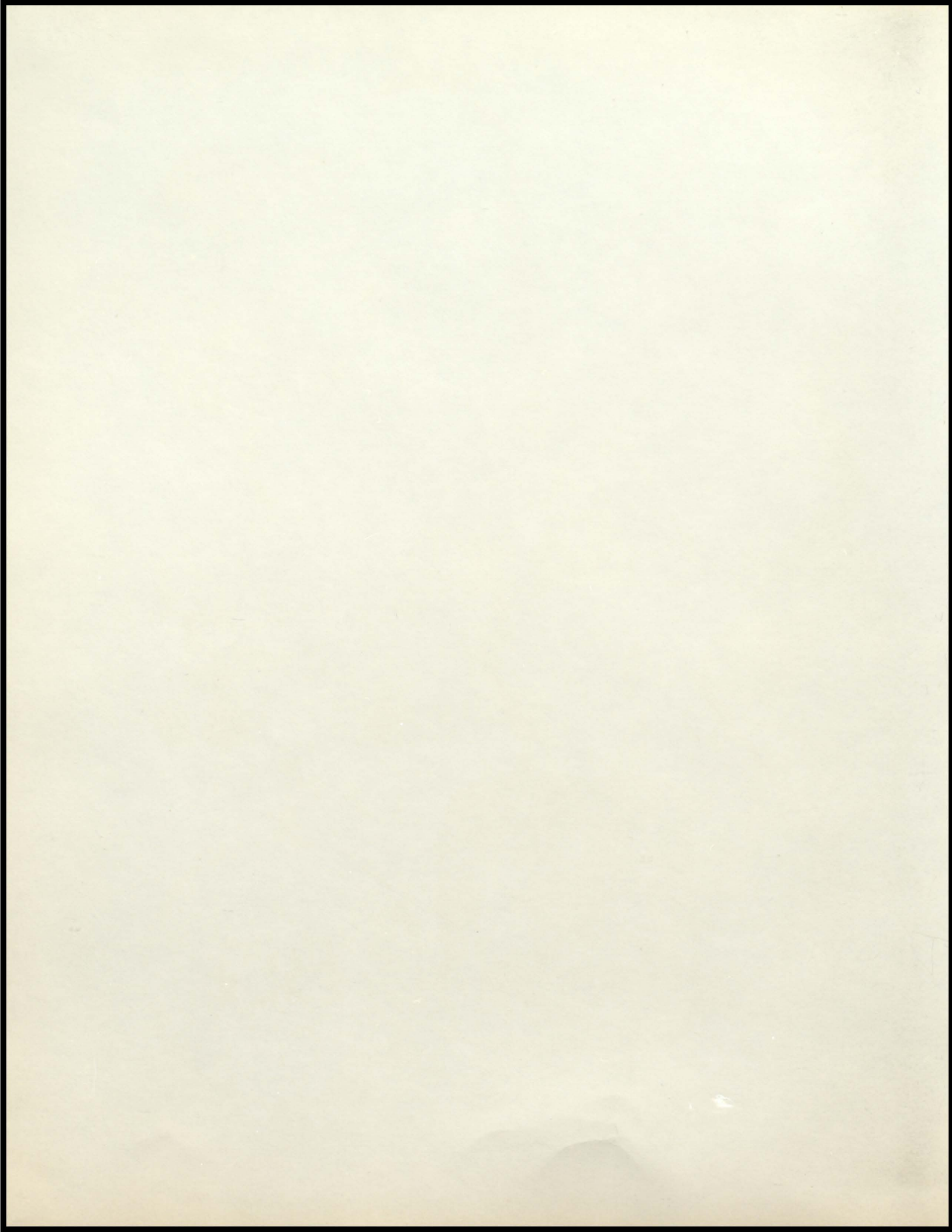

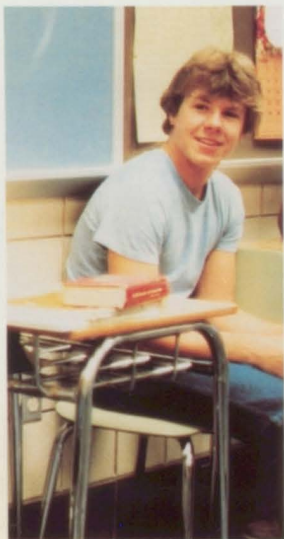

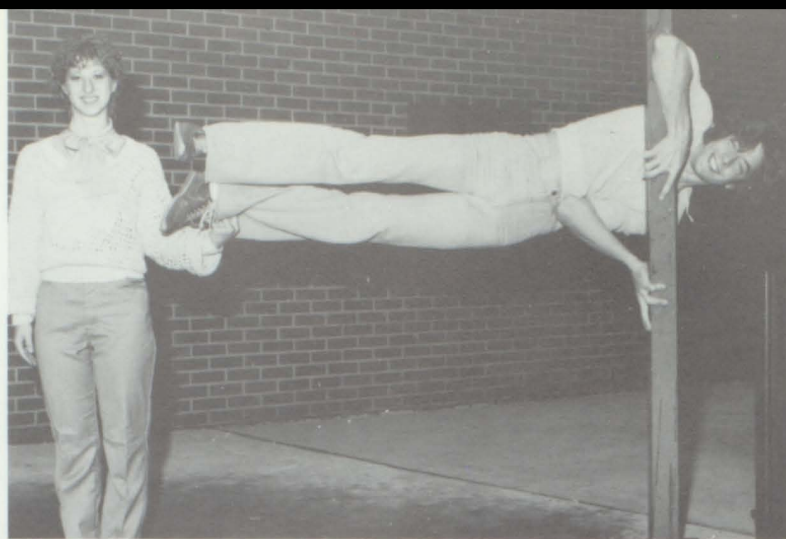

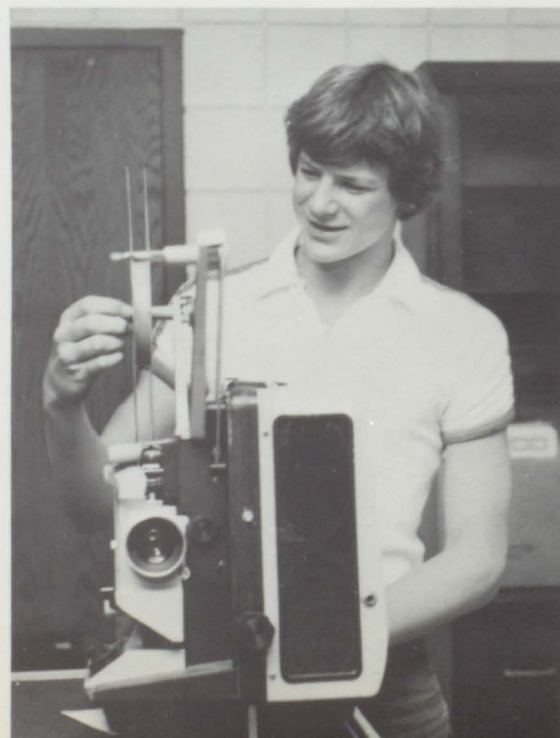

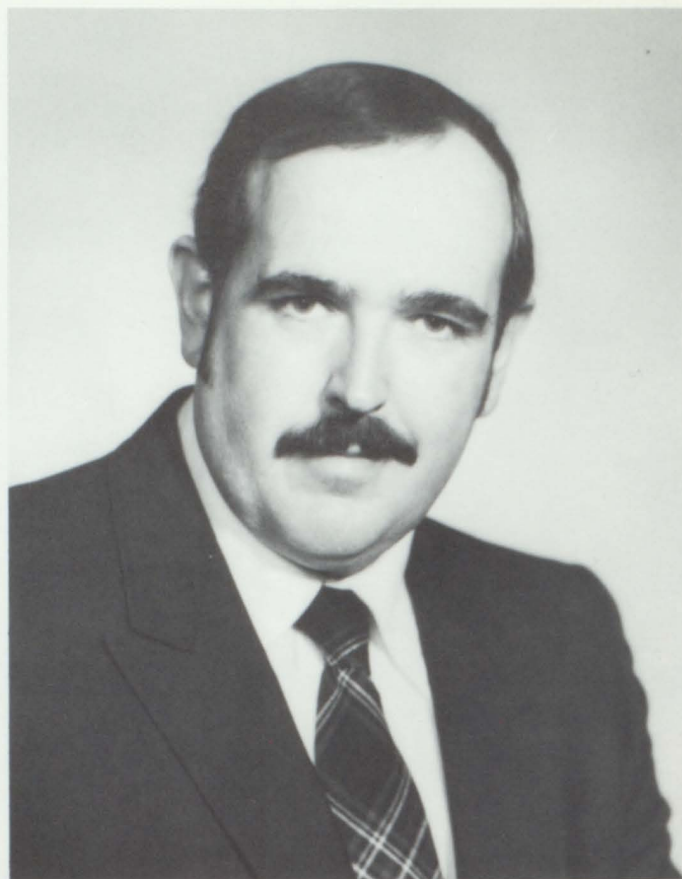
School Board members are the program analysts.

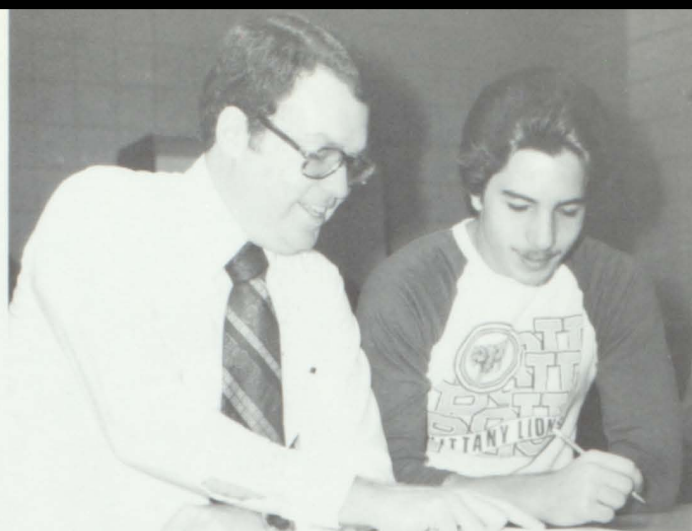

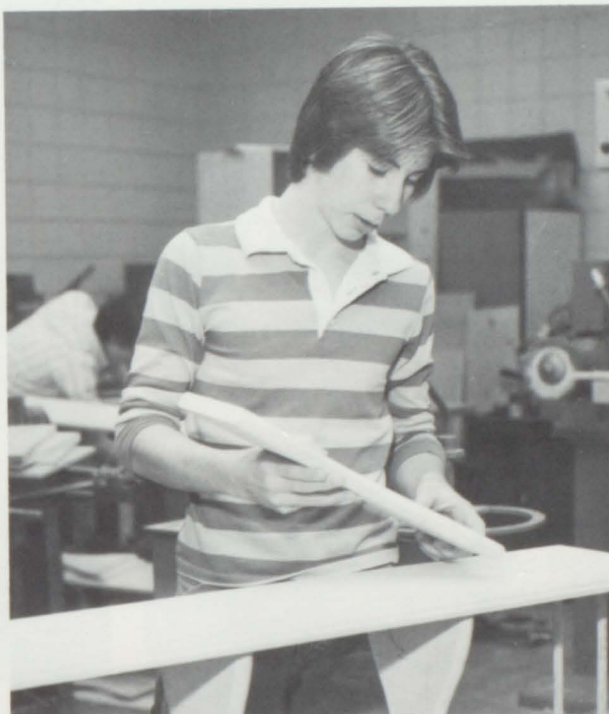

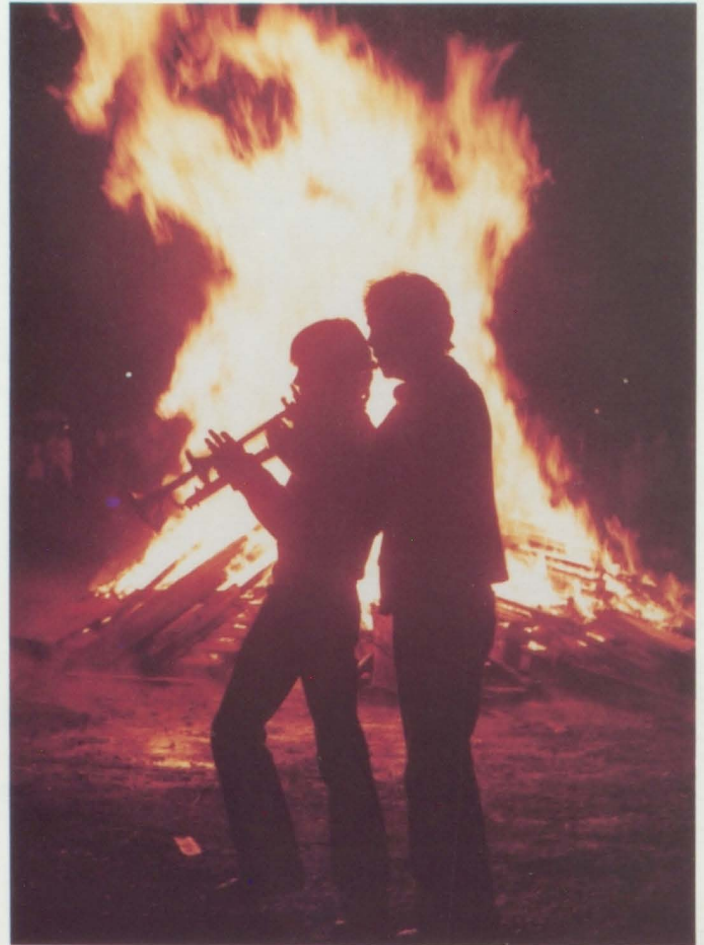

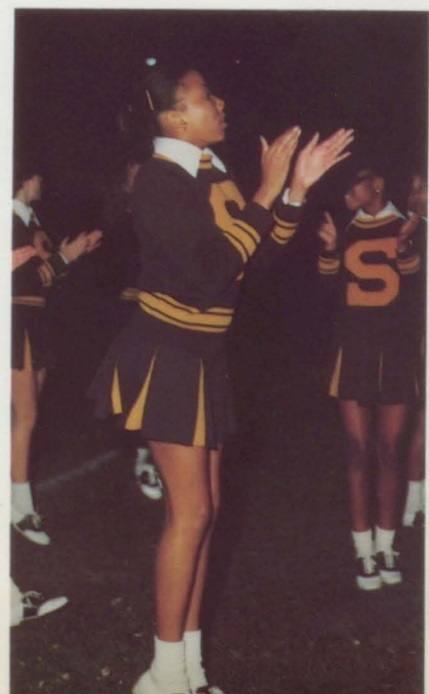

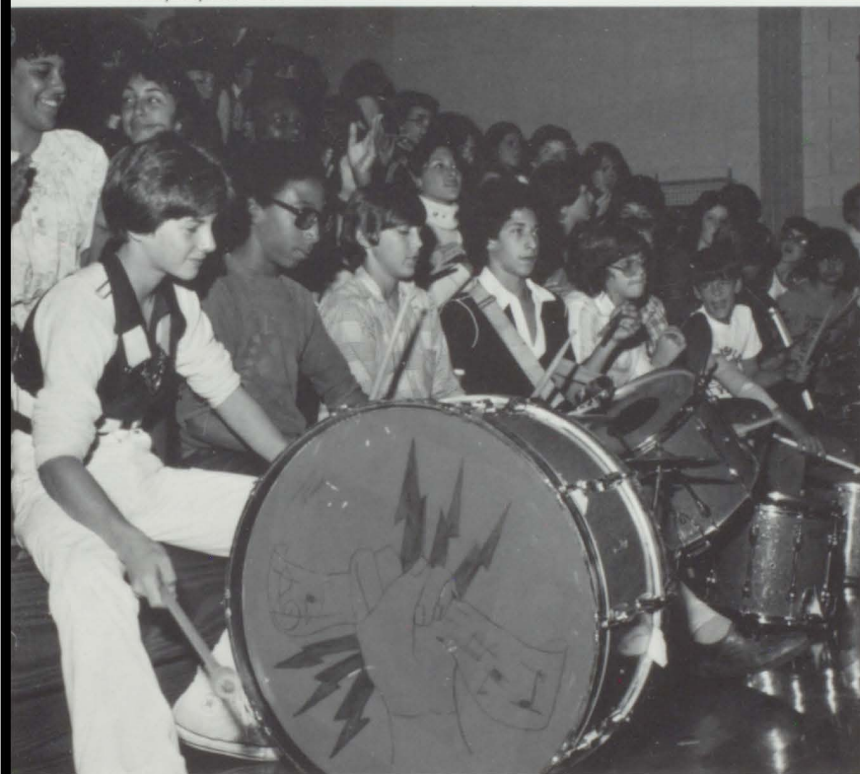

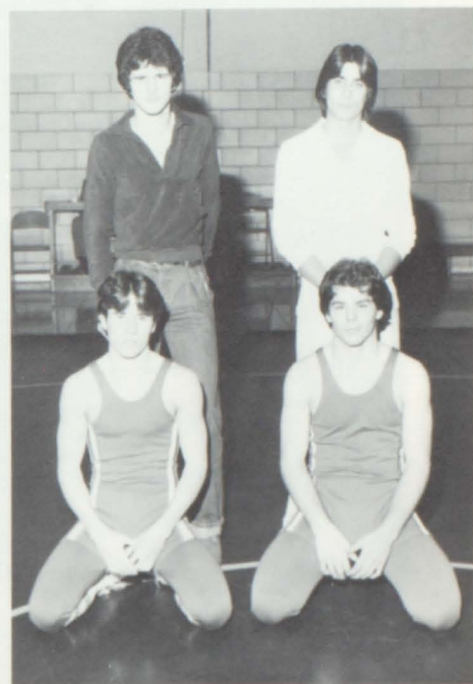

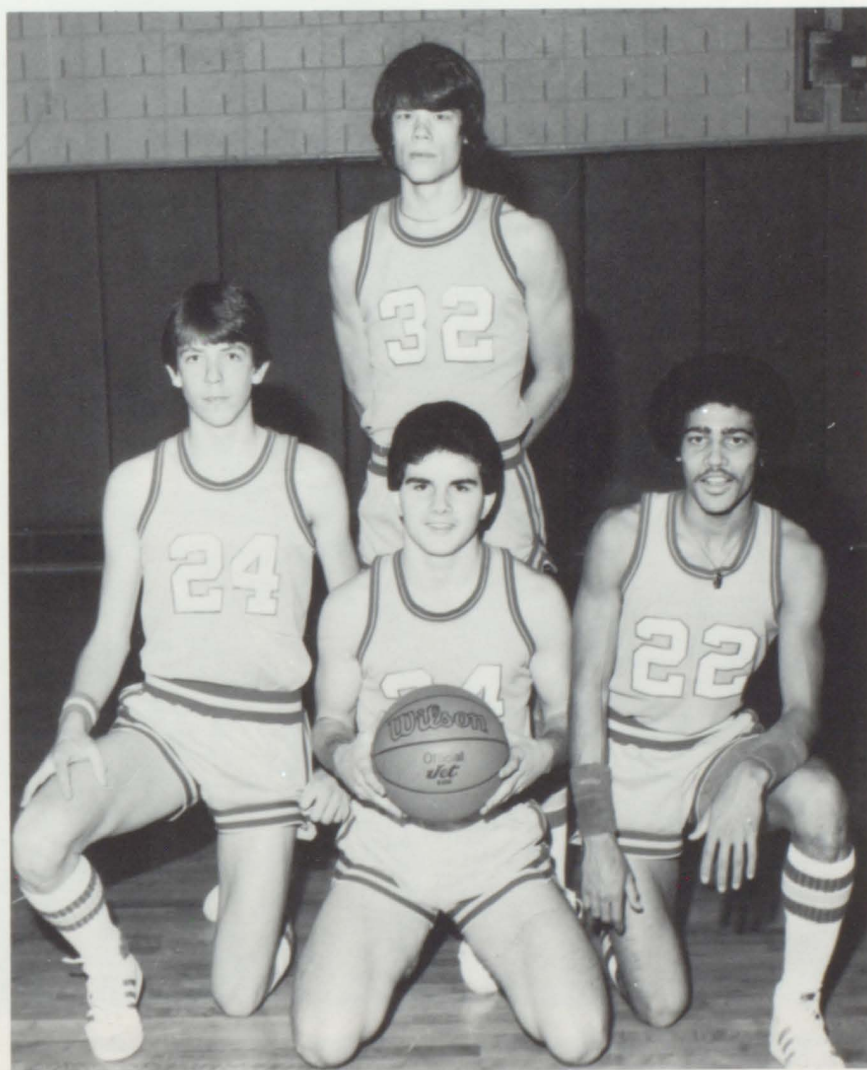

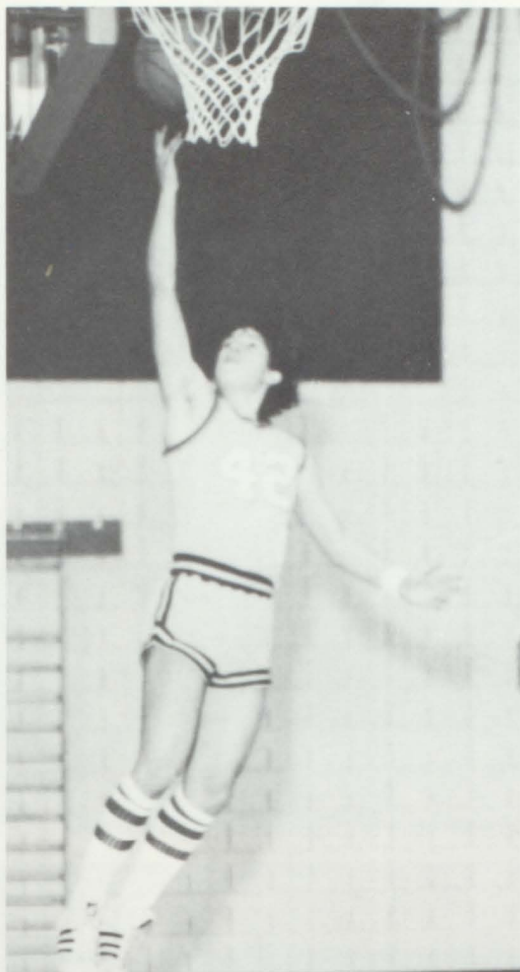

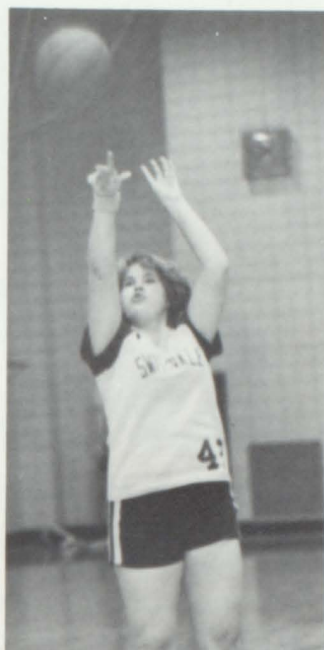

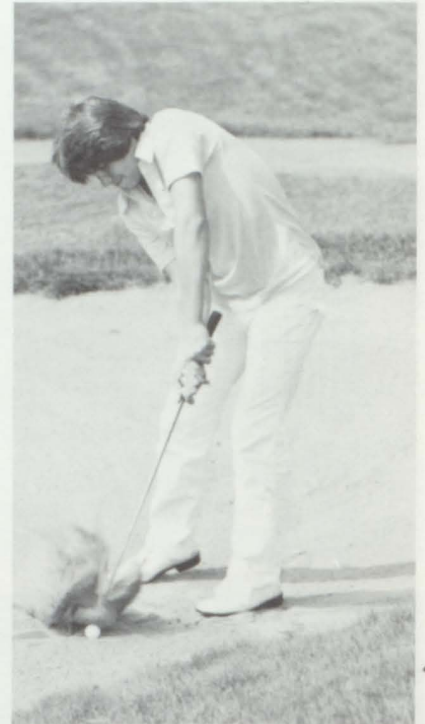

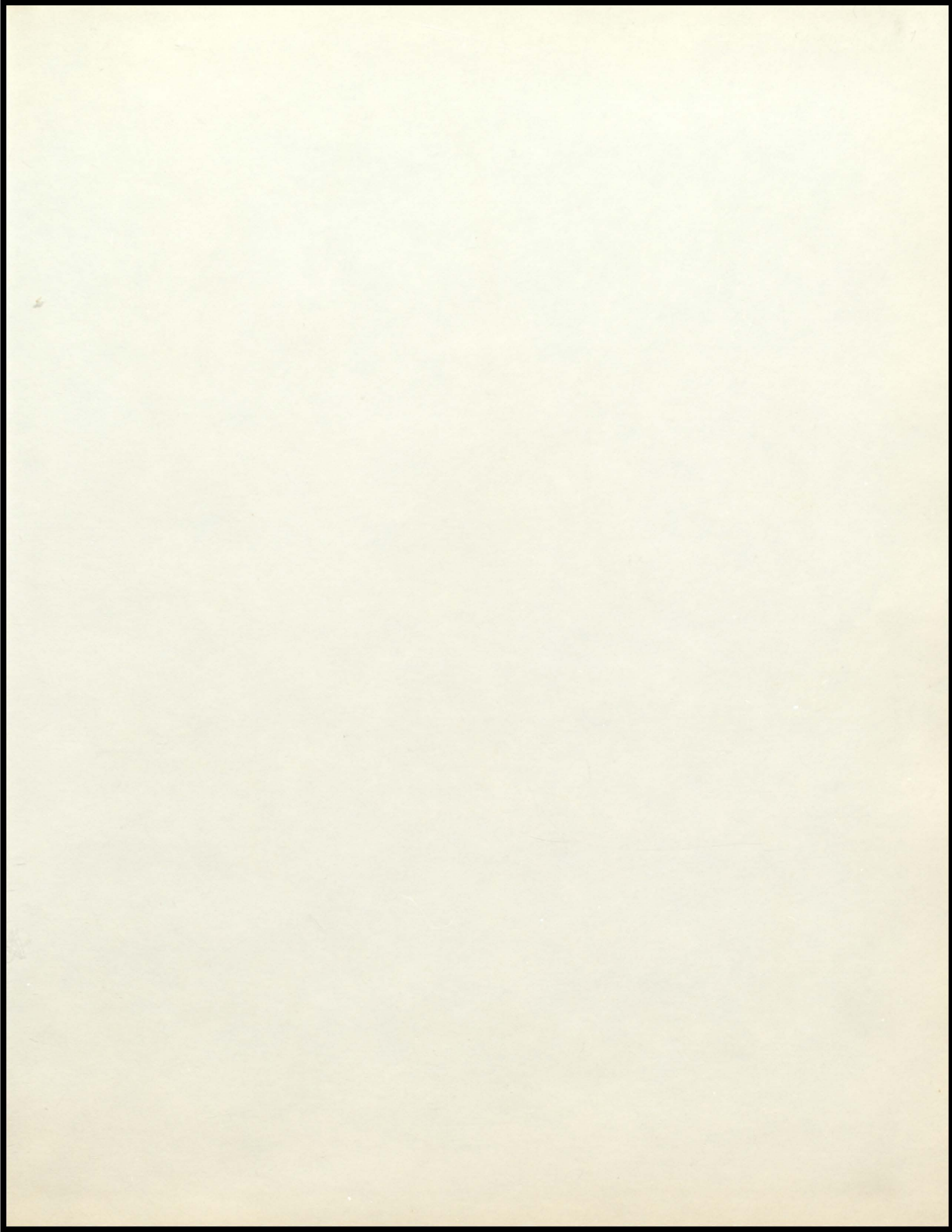

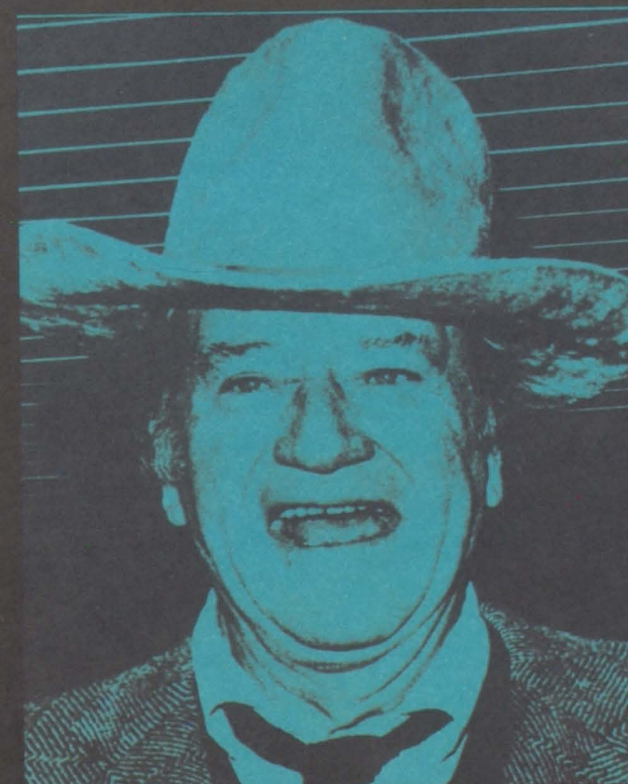
