
Mini program: from the Etzel to the Cadillac.

The English department is a highway traveled by every student during their three year journey at Swissvale Area High School. Sophomores receive the frame work of the vehicle which will enable them to travel this road by taking basic grammar, which is required during the first semester. The venture at Wallops Island, Va. exposed the students to the open-road of oceanography and such routes as seining, beach combing at low tide, an ecological walk through a salt marsh, and a boat trip on a research vessel using various oceanographic equipment. Time was also set aside for identifying species of various types of marine life in the lab. As the four-day experience concluded, the students having mapped out the new highway and having received a more comprehensive look at the ocean and the areas of science it had to offer, packed their bags and headed down the road which lead back to Swissvale. For a short time they had traveled the bluegreen highway of the scientists of the sea.
















